Health Safety Measures

SEASUG is committed to providing a safe environment for our conference attendees. SEASUG is monitoring key sources for COVID-19 and other health safety protocols, including the CDC (Centers for Disease Control), federal, state, and local requirements as well as those from our meeting venue.

Conference Attire

SEASUG does not have a specific dress code; we ask that attendees maintain a clean and neat appearance; many attendees wear business casual.

Attendee Conduct

SEASUG Conferences have three primary goals: Learn, Share, Connect. In that spirit, attendees are asked to be mindful and respectful of each other through their words and actions.

Attendees are expected to behave responsibly at all events. Threatening physical or verbal actions; disorderly or disruptive conduct; and harassment, sexual or otherwise, will not be tolerated.

Behaviors that do not belong at SEASUG Conferences include:

- Disrespecting, heckling, or disrupting a session
- Being disruptive or drinking excessively at social functions
- Stalking, following, threatening, or disrespecting the boundaries of other attendees
- Discrimination or harassment against an individual, group, or class of people (including but not limited to race, gender, or other identifying characteristic)
- Aggressively advocating your own services, products, or causes

If someone makes you or someone else feel unsafe or unwelcome, please let a member of the SEASUG Executive Council know as soon as possible. The Executive Council will investigate all incidents reported with discretion and confidentiality, and reserves the right to revoke the privilege of attendance to any person who violates conference guidelines. This includes revocation of attending SEASUG Conferences in its entirety or in part, and/or to cancel/revoke the conference registration without refund.
